REGULATION AMENDMENTS – STATUS UPDATE

This is a status report for all regulations recently amended, or in the process of being scheduled for review at Public Workshops & Hearings:

LCB File R066-05: Recently adopted. Relates to numerous issues involving the emission testing industry. A copy of this adopted regulation is included with this newsletter.

LCB File R135-05: Recently adopted. Relates to issues involving the Advisory Committee On The Control Of Emissions From Motor Vehicles. R135-05 has been adopted, amendments to this regulation have added representatives of the Department of Agriculture onto the Committee and revised the process for administering grants to local air quality agencies.

LCB File R050-06: This file is currently in the review process. Relates to issues involving the emission testing industry, a mandatory upgrade of analyzer hardware that will enable all analyzers to test CAN compliant vehicles. Public Workshops & Hearings are scheduled for the last week of April. An ET Message has been sent to all emission analyzers providing the information about where and when the meetings will be held.

2G STATION LIST

A number of program stakeholders noted at a recent regulation hearing that it is difficult obtaining updated lists of 2G stations. The Department is responding to the stakeholder concerns:

- 1) 2G lists will continue to be available on the DMV Website. This list will be updated at minimum two times each month and is now sorted by zip code, so that motorists will have an easier time of finding a 2G station within a specific area of the city.
- 2) Station operators can receive a copy of the list by e-mail, each time it is updated, if they would send their e-mail address to: iharper@dmv.nv.gov Ivie will set up an e-mail group of stations that would like to receive the 2G list by e-mail.
- 3) DMV staff will provide a copy of the 2G list each month during overt audits.
