



REGISTER YOUR OHV

It's Now the Law in Nevada!

Off-highway vehicles 1976 and newer must be registered beginning July 1, 2012.

This includes ATVs, quads, dirt bikes, dune buggies, sandrails, snowmobiles and any motor vehicle used on public lands for the purpose of recreation.

Nevada OHV Registration Deadlines

Vehicles purchased after July 1, 2012: Must be registered and titled within 30 days of the purchase.

Vehicles purchased prior to July 1, 2012: Must be registered by July 1, 2013. Titles are optional.

How To Apply

Take your vehicle to a licensed Nevada OHV dealer for a serial number/VIN inspection.

Submit the application and fees *by mail only* to the Department of Motor Vehicles. The dealer may do this for you. Decals are issued *by mail only*. Please do not visit a DMV office unless your vehicle does not have a serial number or VIN. Visit nvohv.com or call (775) 684-4381.



Fees

Most of the registration funds go to benefit the OHV community in the form of trail improvements, public education and law enforcement.



Registration	\$20 per year.
Title	\$28.25 (\$43.25 if the vehicle is not registered or present in Nevada.)
Dealer Fees	\$2 per decal or title application submitted.
